

Proposed Resolution to Prohibit Traffic Surveillance Cameras in Tennessee

Whereas: the people of the great state of Tennessee find ways to create jobs and help eliminate outsourcing of work, and

Whereas: it is our right to travel freely about as we see fit without fear of being tracked by surveillance videos and global positioning satellites, and

Whereas: it is our right to face our accuser in the event of a crime, and electronic monitor/Traffic cameras do not permit this privilege guaranteed by the US Constitution, and

Whereas: electronic monitors/Traffic cameras violate our rights protected under the 5th amendment, and

Whereas: electronic monitors/Traffic cameras violate our rights protected under the 7th amendment, and

Whereas: electronic monitors/Traffic cameras violate our rights protected under the 14th amendment;

Therefore be it so resolved that the State Executive Committee of the Tennessee Republican Party urges the 107th Tennessee Legislature to the support and passage of HB 342 and companion bill SB97.

Be it further resolved that we support the destruction from the devices the data collected on citizens or legal residents of Tennessee in its entirety.
